



IN BETWEEN LIGHTS

If people were lights, what would happen if they overlapped? This is the question Jeremy Herndl poses in his latest exhibition, *In Between Lights*. Inspired by watercolours, he creates haunting oil paintings where lights seem to emerge from the depths of the canvas and different colours mix, intersect and overlap.

Herndl started painting landscapes during hikes around his hometown of Nelson, BC. He then studied at École Nationale Supérieure des Beaux-Arts in Paris in 1995 and completed his BFA at the Nova Scotia College of Art and Design in 1996. Since then, he's had exhibitions across Canada, from Victoria to Toronto to Halifax. He's also worked in London at a printmaking co-op, and in Japan as a scenic painter for Disney Seas Park.

Herndl's previous work has been inspired by the beauty and sadness of the urban landscape and the people within it. "Here we thrive and here we are damned," he says. With *In Between Lights*, his work has evolved to reflect the peculiarities of people as individuals, and the results of their random intersections. "I suppose it's only natural that after working and painting in the city, the subject matter boiled down to lights—and an allegory ensued," he says. *In Between Lights* can be viewed from February 1 to 26 at the Herringer-Kiss Gallery located on 11 Ave SW. —Hajara Thaha
